# STATE RULES FOR FAIRS

TN DEPART. OF AG REGULATORY SERVICES ANIMAL HEALTH SUMMARY: LIVESTOCK HEALTH REQUIRMENTS FOR FAIRS AND EXHIBITIONS

#### I General:

A. All stalls, pens, chutes, etc. located on the grounds of fair and exhibitions shall be thoroughly cleaned and disinfected with a disinfectant ap-proved by USDA, APHIS between each scheduled fair or exhibition.

B. All livestock (except poultry) which enter fairs and exhibitions shall be accompanied by an official veterinary health certificate with individual permanent identification of sufficient description to identify each animal. Certificates for this purpose shall be valid for ninety (90) days from date of issue.

C. No animal showing clinical signs of infectious or communicable disease shall be allowed to enter or remain on premises of fairs or exhibitions. It shall be the responsibility of the manager of each event to assure prompt removal of such animals.

#### II LIVESTOCK AND POULTRY

ORIGINATING WITHIN THE STATE OF TN.

(certificates of Veterinary Inspection Valid for a period of Ninety days)

#### A. SWINE & CATTLE

All Swine & Cattle which enter fairs and exhibitions shall be accompanied by an official veterinary health certificate with individual permanent identification or sufficient description to identify each animal.

#### B. POULTRY

- (1) Sponsors of poultry shows or exhibitions shall notify the TN Dept. of Ag at least thirty (30) days prior to show or exhibition.
- (2)All poultry assembled at shows or exhibitions shall be accompanied by evidence of a negative test for Pullorum-Typhoid within ninety (90) days or originate directly from flock which has been certified as Pullorum-Typhoid Clean under the TN Poultry Improvement Plan.
- (3) Poultry found not to be in apparent good health shall be removed immediately from any show or exhibition.

#### C. HORSES & OTHER EQUIDAE:

Horses and other Equidae six (6) months of age or older must have a negative Equine Infectious Anemia test within the preceding twelve months.

#### D. SHEEP & GOATS

Sheep & Goats must have an official veterinary health certificate as provided in Rule 0080-2-3-.01.

(1) and meet the requirements of the National Scrapie Identification Program.

#### E. CAMELIDS & CAPTIVE CERVIDAE

Camelids & Captive Cervidae must have an official veterinary health certificate as provided in rule 0080-2-3-.01.

# III LIVESTOCK AND POULTRY ORIGINATING OUTSIDE THE STATE OF TN

Livestock and Poultry entering fairs and exhibitions from areas outside of the state of TN shall be subject to current TN import requirements. Please contact the state veterinarian's office regarding questions or recent changes to these rules. These interstate requirements are summarized as follows:

A. ALL SPECIES (except poultry): Official Certificate of Veterinary Inspection valid for thirty (30) days.

#### B. CATTLE & CAMELIDAE:

Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and additional requirements as follows:

- (1) Tuberculosis: No requirements. Owners of MI, TX, NM and CA origin cattle should contact the state
- veterinarian's office for further information.
- (2) Brucellosis: Test eligible cattle Intact male of female cattle 18 months or older. (Vaccinates and non-VaccinatCertified Herds – No test requirements Class Free States – No test requirments Class A – Negative test within thirty (30) days.
- C. SWINE
- (1) Breeding Swine: (a) 30 day negative test for pseudorabies, or



#### STATE RULES for FAIRS cont.

- (b) Originate from Qualified Negative Pseudorabies Herd. or
- (c) Originate directly from a herd in a stage V (Pseudorabies-free) state, and
- (d) If four (4) months of age or older:
- (1) Negative test for brucellosis within Thirty (30) days or
- (2) Originate directly form a validated Brucellosis-Free Herd, or
- (3) Originate directly from a validated Brucellosis-Free State.
- (2) Feeding Swine: (a) Thirty (30) day negative test for pseudorabies, or
- (b) Originate from Qualified Negative Pseudorabies Herd. or
- (c) Originate from Pseudorabies Monitored Herd, or
- (d) Originate from a herd in a stage III, IV or V state in the National Pseudorabies Eradication Program.
- D. HORSES AND OTHE EQUINES;
- Animals six (6) months of age or older negative equine infectious anemia (swamp fever) test within twelve (12) months.

#### E. POULTRY:

- Originate directly from a Pullorum-Typhoid Clean Flock, or be accompanied by evidence of negative Pullorum-Typhoid test within ninety (90) days.
- F. SHEEP & GOATS:
- Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and meet the requirements of the National Scrapie Identification Program.

#### G. CERVIDAE:

- Certificate of Veterinary Inspection and additional requirements as follow:
- Brucellosis: Test eligible cervidae Intact male of female cattle 18 months or older. (Vaccinates and non-Vaccinates)
- (2)Tuberculosis:
- (a) All cervidae shall originate in herds which have had a negative herd test for tuberculosis within 12 months with a USDA approved single cervical test and individual imported animals shall be negative to the single cervical test within 30 days of entry or
- (b) Animals not originating in tested herds as described above must test negative to 2 single cervical tests at least 90 days apart, the second test conducted not more than 30 days prior to entry.
- NOTE: (Contact an accredited veterinarian for further details of imported rules).
- IV. Fair association or exhibition or management shall inform exhibitors of the rules of this chapter, and shall notify the State Veterinarian or his agent of any violations. Exhibitors shall present evi-dence of compliance with this chapter to the State Veterinarian or his agent upon request.

These rules constitute a minimum legal standard and in no way restrict the right of fair and exhibition managers to establish additional or more stringent requirements.



# GENERAL FAIR REGULATIONS

Absolutely NO premium will be paid on any entry in any category unless authorized by the Directors or in an emergency by the Executive Committee.

- Competition in the Warren County Agricultural and Livestock Fair is under the direction of the Warren County Fair Association and is open to all residents or taxpayers of Warren County.
- 2. The Association, in the interest of the exhibitors and the public, reserves the right to change any and all rules and classes, or to declare off, any class, if in its opinion such is not worthy, nor up to standard, or if weather conditions are unfavorable for show or performance.
- 3. Articles and animals placed on exhibit shall be under the control of the Association that they may be shown to advantage. However, the Association assumes no responsibility for losses or damages to any article or animal. The Association will take every precaution and will make every effort to safeguard each exhibit, but beyond an honest effort will not be responsible for losses and damages to articles, or for damages done by any animal or animals.
- 4. Entries will be made in the name of their rightful owner and in the correct name and year for that entry. Unless otherwise stated in the department, all exhibits shall be of this year's production, some classes of livestock excepted.
- 5. Only one entry per person per lot or class.
- 6. The superintendent of each department shall be responsible for the proper arrange-ment, handling and showing of the articles under his supervision. The Association cannot be obligated by any promise, oral or written, that a superintendent may make an exhibitor as to the handling of an exhibit or display.
- 7. Entries, except as given under the proper headings, cannot be removed until the hour specified by the rules in that department. Exhibitors entering articles or animals do so with the full understanding that such exhibits cannot be removed from the exhibiting space until the hour of removal from the fair.
- 8. Any entry not left until proper time will not be eligible for prize. In addition, if entry is removed, exhibitor may be prohibited from exhibition for next season.
- 9. The Association shall, upon the recommendation of the Board of Directors, declare ineligible any animal or product for

- exhibition that may be below par, not up to standard, or infected, sick, poor breeding, or otherwise unfit for public showing. (Animals and articles shown for comparison in educational exhibits not included in this ruling.)
- 10. In case of only one entry, 1st premium will be paid provided that entry is comparable should additional entries have been made. Should an entry not be comparable in quality, the judge shall place the exhibit accordingly and the Association will pay the premium as Judged.
- 11. All animals in or out of shows must be under halter and in the care of the owner. Hitching posts will be provided and exhibitors and visitors must comply with the rules for safety.
- 12. Herdsmen will keep grounds and quarters clean.
- 13. Animals entered and shown as for butcher cannot be shown in breeding classes.
- 14. Animals shown by boys and girls cannot be shown again as being owned by adults, nor can animals shown by adults be shown by youth.
- 15. If the need arises, the superintendent may call for proof of age of the animal, registration, and ownership, etc. The exhibitors shall comply with the request.
- 16. There shall be "call to show" and exhibitors must respond immediately to show classes of livestock.
- 17. Persons other than the exhibitor or caretaker of an animal should not enter the arena during a show.
- 18. Farm Bred Exhibitors must be breeders of all animals shown in this class.
- 19. Entry receipts will be issued, and the exhibitor assumes the responsibility of having such tag ready when his entry is being taken from the exhibitor's space. The owners of livestock shall attach entry tag to halter of the animal being shown. No exhibit to be released without entry receipt. Exhibitors will not take any article or animal etc. without checking with superintendent or attendant on duty.
- 20. Exhibitors will exercise every care about light and fire in stalls and in the buildings of the fairgrounds. Candles, kerosene lanterns, etc., will not be permitted in the cattle barns. Exhibitors are warned not to use hot plates, percolators, and other such equipment in their show space in the barns.
- 21. Smoking not allowed in barn areas.



#### **GENERAL FAIR REGULATIONS cont.**

- 22. Most premiums will be paid by check, and such checks must be cashed on or before Oct. 15 of the current year. If, even after a premium check has been issued an exhibitor, the Association shall secure bonafide proof of illegal entry, the right to cancel payment of the premium is retained until proper adjustment or settlement is made between the exhibitor and the Association.
  23. Suitable ribbons of award will be given as follows: First prize, single or multiple entries Blue Ribbons Second prize, single or multiple entries Red Ribbons Third prize, single or multiple entries Yellow Ribbons Fourth prize, single or multiple entries Pink Ribbons All others, single or multiple entries Pink Ribbons All others, single or multiple entries Indications Champion or Sweepstakes Purple Ribbons
- 24. Should an exhibitor feel that his exhibit failed to reach the placing anticipated, an appeal may be made to the Board through the head of the department under which the show was held. While the Association anticipates that all citizens will be "good sports" in both winning and losing, it cannot adjust placing beyond that of competent judges.
- 25. Rooms or exhibit space shall be closed to the public during judging. Exhibitors will comply with this rule.

- 26. Operators of concessions will be guided in their operation of stands by the rules of the Superintendent of Concessions.
- 27. There shall be no concession used for the sale or exchange of any and all alcoholic beverages on the fairgrounds. The Association shall make every effort possible to present a clean fair, and requests the full cooperation of every citizen, to whom the fair actually belongs.
- 28. The Warren County A & L Fair Association will make an annual report to the Legislative Body of the county of all activities by the Board of Directors, Superintendents, and others assigned duties for the fair.
- 29. Correspondence should be addressed to: Wayne Davenport, Secretary, P.O. Box 97, Viola, TN 37394.
- 30. The fairgrounds will be open to exhibitors on **Friday, Sept. 5, 2025.**
- 31. State amusement tax will be collected where applicable.
- 32. The Fair Association reserves the right to disqualify all entries of any person interfering with judges, clerks, or placing of ribbons.
- 33. No pets of any kind will be allowed on the grounds during the operating hours of the fair.
- 34. Working dogs, drug dogs, or service animals or dogs assisting with crowd control will be allowed on the grounds anywhere and at any time.

- 3. Scarecrows should represent this years Fair Theme: Cream of the Crop
- 4. Entries must be hand-made. **No** commercial costumes, rubber or plastic mask etc. Feel free to use your imagination but should be in good taste and not intended to be offensive, gruesome, or scary in anyway. Remember that the Warren County A&L Fair is a family event.
- 5. Each Scarecrow will be given a 4x4 spot. You will need to provide your own self supporting base. No electricity will be available. Please ensure decorations and props are firmly attached.
- 6. Provide a sign to display the name of your scarecrow, your groups name and your scarecrows entry number ( A number will be assigned with your entry confirmation).
- 7. Scarecrows should be mostly assembled prior to arrival and setup. Scarecrow set up will be on Thursday Sept 4th between the hours of 6pm and 9pm and will be displayed on the grounds September 5th September 13th.
- 8. Entries may be picked up on Sunday September 14th between the hours of 2pm-4pm. Winnings will also be available for pickup. Any entry not picked up or left behind will become the property of the Warren County A&L Fair.
- Scarecrows will be displayed on the fair grounds in the outside weather. The Warren County A&L Fair will not be responsible or liable for any loss or damages to entries.




